

FINAL RESOLUTION
(Empire Telephone Corporation Project)

A regular meeting of the Steuben County Industrial Development Agency was convened on Thursday, February 28, 2019, at 12:00 p.m.

The following resolution was duly offered and seconded, to wit:

RESOLUTION OF THE STEUBEN COUNTY INDUSTRIAL DEVELOPMENT AGENCY (THE "AGENCY") (i) ACKNOWLEDGING THE PUBLIC HEARING HELD WITH RESPECT TO THE EMPIRE TELEPHONE CORPORATION PROJECT (AS MORE FULLY DESCRIBED BELOW), (ii) AUTHORIZING FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE TO EMPIRE TELEPHONE CORPORATION (THE "COMPANY") IN EXCESS OF \$100,000, AND (iii) AUTHORIZING THE EXECUTION AND DELIVERY BY THE AGENCY OF AN AGENT, FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE AND PROJECT AGREEMENT, LEASE AGREEMENT, LEASEBACK AGREEMENT, PAYMENT-IN-LIEU-OF-TAX AGREEMENT AND RELATED DOCUMENTS WITH RESPECT TO THE PROJECT

WHEREAS, by Title 1 of Article 18-A of the General Municipal Law of the State of New York, as amended, and Chapter 178 of the Laws of 1972 of the State of New York, as amended (hereinafter collectively called the "Act"), **STEUBEN COUNTY INDUSTRIAL DEVELOPMENT AGENCY** (the "Agency") was created with the authority and power to own, lease and sell property for the purpose of, among other things, acquiring, constructing and equipping industrial, manufacturing and commercial facilities as authorized by the Act; and

WHEREAS, **EMPIRE TELEPHONE CORPORATION**, for itself or on behalf of an entity to be formed by it or on its behalf (the "Company") has submitted an application (the "Application"), a copy of which is on file with the Agency, requesting the Agency's assistance with respect to a certain project (the "Project") consisting of: (i) the acquisition by the Agency of a leasehold interest in certain property located at 34 and 26 Main Street, Town of Prattsburgh, Steuben County, New York (the "Land") and the existing improvements located thereon consisting principally of two (2) dilapidated vacant buildings (the "Existing Improvements"), (ii) the reconstruction, renovation and rehabilitation on the Land of the Existing Improvements consisting of connecting the two (2) vacant buildings and renovating the same to create a state-of-the-art customer service and network operations center (the "Improvements"), (iii) the acquisition and installation by the Company in and around the Existing Improvements and Improvements of certain items of equipment and other tangible personal property to undertake the Project, including, but not limited to, office furniture and cubes, phone system equipment, routers, switches, televisions, four (4) bucket trucks and three (3) additional vehicles as part of the Company's customer service and network support operations (the "Equipment"; and, collectively with the Land, the Existing Improvements and the Improvements, the "Facility"); and

WHEREAS, by resolution adopted by the Agency on January 24, 2019 (the "Inducement Resolution"), the Agency accepted the Application as submitted by the Company and, among other things, (i) described the Financial Assistance (as defined in the Inducement Resolution) being contemplated by the Agency, (ii) authorized the Agency to hold a public hearing, and (iii) made a determination with respect to the Project pursuant to Article 8 of the Environmental Conservation Law and 6 N.Y.C.R.R. Part 617 (collectively referred to as "SEQRA"), and (iv) authorized the negotiation of an Agent, Financial Assistance and Project Agreement (the "Project Agreement"), Lease Agreement, Leaseback Agreement, Payment-in-Lieu-of-Tax Agreement (the "Tax Agreement") and related documents; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to General Municipal Law Section 859-a, on February 25, 2019, at 10:00 a.m., local time, in the Courtroom at Prattsburgh Town Hall, 19 North Main Street, Prattsburgh, New York 14873, the Agency held a public hearing with respect to the Project and the proposed Financial Assistance being contemplated by the Agency (the "Public Hearing") whereat interested parties were provided a reasonable opportunity, both orally and in writing, to present their views. A copy of the minutes of the Public Hearing along with the notice of the Public Hearing published and forwarded to the affected taxing jurisdictions at least ten (10) days prior to said Public Hearing are attached hereto as Exhibit A; and

WHEREAS, the Agency desires to adopt a resolution (i) acknowledging that the Public Hearing was held in compliance with the Act, (ii) authorizing the execution and delivery by the Agency of a Project Agreement, Lease Agreement, Leaseback Agreement, Tax Agreement and related documents, and (iii) authorizing Financial Assistance to the Company in excess of \$100,000; and

WHEREAS, the Project Agreement, Lease Agreement, Leaseback Agreement and Tax Agreement and related documents have been negotiated and are presented to this meeting for execution.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE STEUBEN COUNTY INDUSTRIAL DEVELOPMENT AGENCY AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The Public Hearing held by the Agency on February 25, 2019, concerning the Project and the Financial Assistance was duly held in accordance with the Act, including but not limited to the giving of at least ten (10) days published notice of the Public Hearing (such notice also provided to the Chief Executive Officer of each affected tax jurisdiction), affording interested parties a reasonable opportunity, both orally and in writing, to present their views with respect to the Project.

Section 2. The Agency is hereby authorized to provide Financial Assistance to the Company in the form of (a) a sales and use tax exemption for purchases and rentals related to the acquisition, construction and equipping of the Project and (b) a partial real property tax abatement structured through the Tax Agreement (collectively, the "Financial Assistance").

Section 3. Based upon the representation and warranties made by the Company in the Application, the Agency hereby authorizes and approves the Company, as its agent, to make purchases of goods and services relating to the Project and that would otherwise be subject to New York State and local sales and use tax in an amount up to approximately **\$1,330,000**, which result in New York State and local sales and use tax exemption benefits ("sales and use tax exemption benefits") not to exceed **\$106,000**. The Agency agrees to consider any requests by the Company for increase to the amount of sales and use tax exemption benefits authorized by the Agency upon being provided with appropriate documentation detailing the additional purchases of property or services, and, to the extent required, the Agency authorizes and conducts any supplemental public hearing(s).

Section 4. Pursuant to Section 875(3) of the Act, the Agency may recover or recapture from the Company, its agents, consultants, subcontractors, or any other party authorized to make purchases for the benefit of the Project, any sales and use tax exemption benefits taken or purported to be taken by the Company, its agents, consultants, subcontractors, or any other party authorized to make purchases for the benefit of the Project, if it is determined that: (i) the Company, its agents, consultants, subcontractors, or any other party authorized to make purchases for the benefit of the Project, is not entitled to the sales and use tax exemption benefits; (ii) the sales and use tax exemption benefits are in excess of the amounts authorized to be taken by the Company, its agents, consultants, subcontractors, or any other party authorized to make purchases for the benefit of the Project; (iii) the sales and use tax exemption benefits are for property or services not authorized by the Agency as part of the Project; (iv) the Company has made a material false statement on its application for financial assistance; (v) the sales and use tax exemption benefits are taken in cases where the Company, its agents, consultants, subcontractors, or any other party authorized to make purchases for the benefit of the Project fails to comply with a material term or condition to use property or services in the manner approved by the Agency in connection with the Project; and/or (vi) the Company obtains real property tax abatements and fails to comply with a material term or condition to use property or services in the manner approved by the Agency in connection with the Project (collectively, items (i) through (vi) hereby defined as a "Recapture Event").

As a condition precedent of receiving sales and use tax exemption benefits and real property tax abatement benefits, the Company, its agents, consultants, subcontractors, or any other party authorized to make purchases for the benefit of the Project, must (i) if a Recapture Event determination is made by the Agency, cooperate with the Agency in its efforts to recover or recapture any sales and use tax exemption benefits and/or real property tax abatements abatement benefits, and (ii) promptly pay over any such amounts to the Agency that the Agency demands, if and as so required to be paid over as determined by the Agency.

Section 5. Subject to the Company executing the Project Agreement and the delivery to the Agency of a binder, certificate or other evidence of liability insurance policy for the Project satisfactory to the Agency, the Agency hereby authorizes the Company to proceed with the acquisition, construction and equipping of the Project and hereby appoints the Company as the true and lawful agent of the Agency: (i) to acquire, reconstruct, renovate and equip the Project; (ii) to make, execute, acknowledge and deliver any contracts, orders, receipts, writings and instructions, as the stated agent for the Agency with the authority to delegate such agency, in

whole or in part, to agents, subagents, contractors, and subcontractors of such agents and subagents and to such other parties as the Company chooses; and (iii) in general, to do all things which may be requisite or proper for completing the Project, all with the same powers and the same validity that the Agency could do if acting in its own behalf; *provided, however*, the Project Agreement shall expire on **December 31, 2019** (*unless extended for good cause by the Executive Director of the Agency*) if the Lease Agreement, the Leaseback Agreement and the Tax Agreement contemplated have not been executed and delivered

Section 6. The Chairman, Vice Chairman and/or the Executive Director of the Agency are hereby authorized, on behalf of the Agency, to negotiate and execute (A) the Project Agreement, pursuant to which the Company is appointed an agent of the Agency, (B) the Lease Agreement, pursuant to which the Company leases the Project to the Agency, (C) the related Leaseback Agreement, pursuant to which the Agency leases its interest in the Project back to the Company, and (D) the Tax Agreement (the terms of which shall provide a full exemption from ad valorem taxation with respect to the Facility, provided, however, the Company must satisfy certain conditions for such exemption as set forth in the Tax Agreement); provided (i) the rental payments under the Leaseback Agreement include payments of all costs incurred by the Agency arising out of or related to the Project and indemnification of the Agency by the Company for actions taken by the Company and/or claims arising out of or related to the Project; and (ii) the terms of the Tax Agreement are consistent with the Agency's Uniform Tax Exemption Policy or the procedures for deviation have been complied with.

Section 7. The officers, employees and agents of the Agency are hereby authorized and directed for and in the name and on behalf of the Agency to do all acts and things required and to execute and deliver all such certificates, instruments and documents, to pay all such fees, charges and expenses and to do all such further acts and things as may be necessary or, in the opinion of the officer, employee or agent acting, desirable and proper to effect the purposes of the foregoing resolutions and to cause compliance by the Agency with all of the terms, covenants and provisions of the documents executed for and on behalf of the Agency.

Section 8. These Resolutions shall take effect immediately.


